

History of the Catholic Church By Deacon Rajan

It must be said that St. Bernard of Clairvaux tried heroically to prevent such anti-Jewish behavior in subsequent crusades and was summoned by the archbishop of Mainz to denounce a hot-headed monk named Raoul, who thought that the logical first step of a crusade was the killing of Jews. Even as early as the 1130s, before the calling of the Second

Crusade, Bernard was preaching against the injustices done to the Jews, saying that the Jews were "the apple of God's eye," so that the Jews of the Rhineland considered him a "righteous Gentile."

When the People's Crusade arrived in Hungary, they brawled with the natives and left four thousand dead. They sacked the city of Belgrade, the population of which had fled in their wake. The emperor in Constantinople was nervous about their presence and lack of discipline in the area but, after cautioning them to wait for the real armies not far behind them, shuttled them over to Asia Minor, where they were massacred by the Turks. Only two thousand to three thousand of the estimated forty thousand survived, including Peter the Hermit, who would join the next crusade. Despite its disastrous outcome, however, the People's Crusade served a purpose: it lulled the Turks into thinking that they had defeated their principal opponent, and they got back to fighting each other, not realizing that the greatest military expedition in human history was headed right in their direction.

As time went on, the camp followers and families were told to stay home, and the professional soldiers pressed on. The armies that were organized by the lords of Europe were made up of knights, who were heavily armored and rode large Belgian workhorses, which were also heavily armored. The knights were professional soldiers, but they would be assisted by a platoon of five to ten foot-soldiers, who would assist the knight in mounting and dismounting and would use him as a shield, much like patrols used tanks during World War II.


