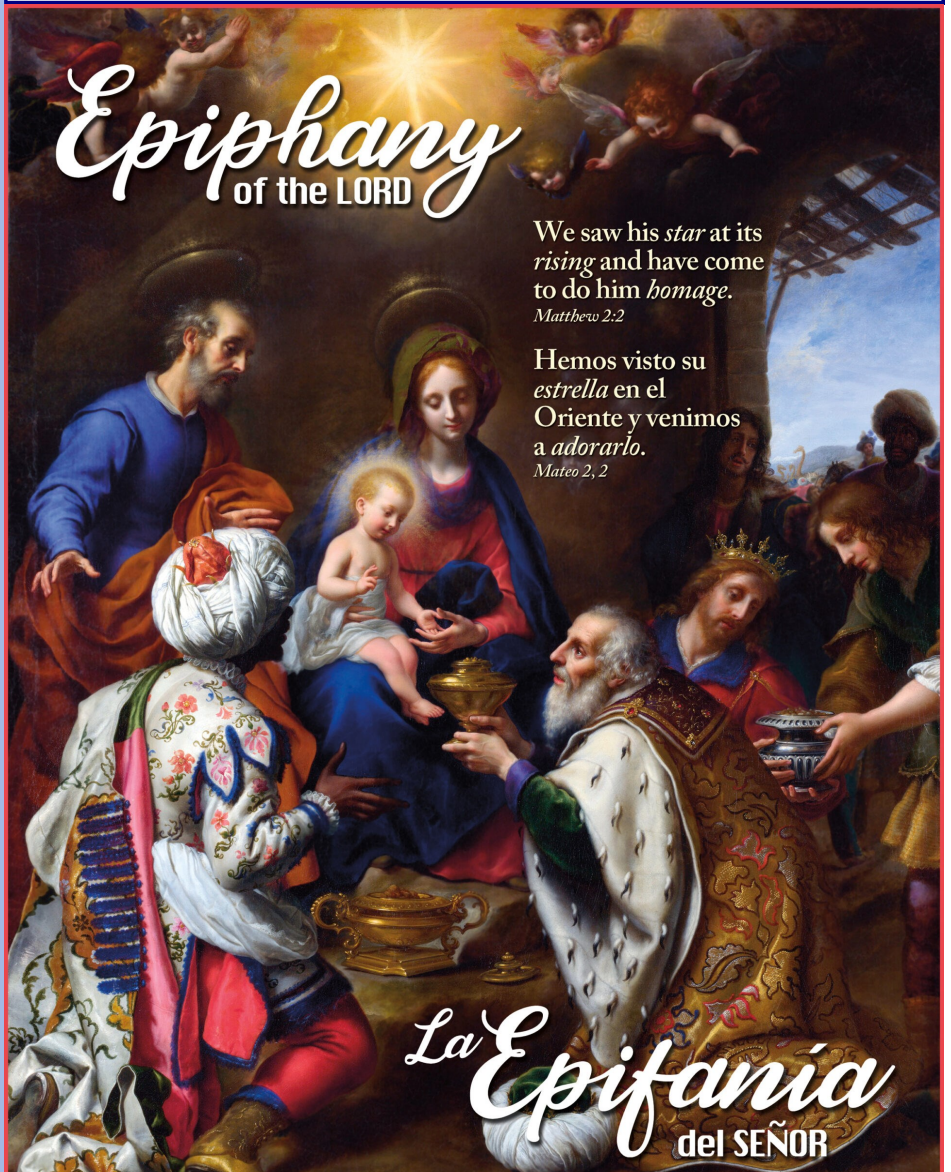

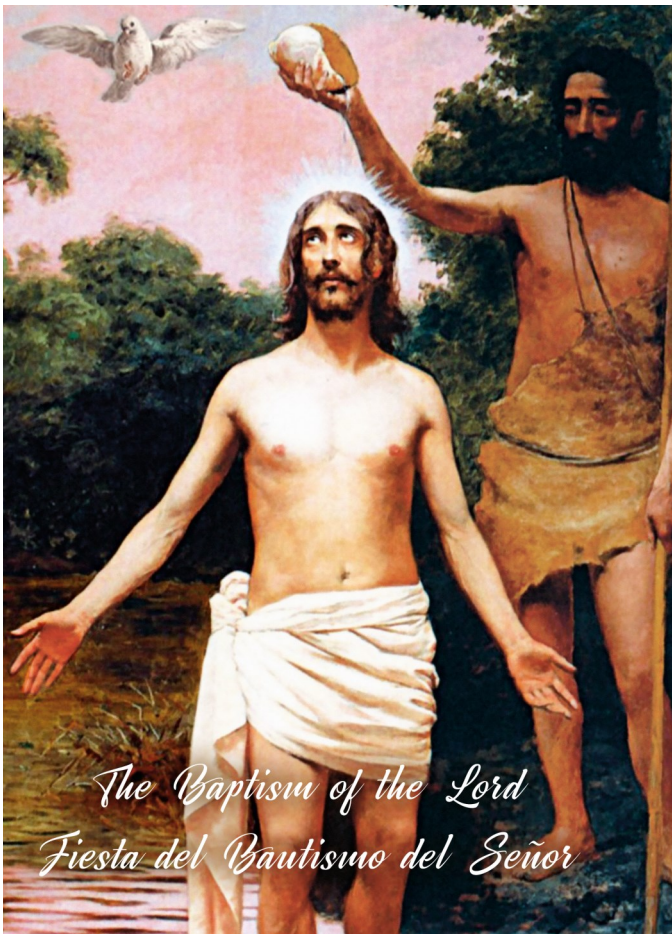
History of the Catholic Church By Deacon Rajan

The red cross was devised to represent the crusade. It consisted of a large red cross in the center, surrounded by four crosses: the Jerusalem Cross. It signified the five wounds of Jesus: the nails that pierced his hands, his feet, and his side. Another cross was the Maltese Cross, which was also red. When the First Crusade was first preached in Clermont by Urban II in 1095, excitement was so widespread that red material ran out, and people demanded to be tattooed with the red cross. To this day Muslims are uncomfortable with the notion of the Red Cross as a relief agency and prefer to name their comparable organization the “Red Crescent.” Descendants of crusading religious orders, such as the Knights of the Holy Sepulcher, still use the Jerusalem Cross as an emblem to this day. Before the First Crusade was organized by professional soldiers, enthusiasm for defending the Holy Places propelled a ragtag army that consisted of the poorly armed and poorly led faithful, led by a charismatic preacher named Peter the Hermit—only one quarter of his “army” consisted of fighting men. His attempt, known as the People’s Crusade, was a considerable disaster. It rambled through Germany and Hungary, fighting Jews (when they could be found) and other native populations over scarce resources. The animosity of these crusaders toward Jews was so great that it distracted them from their main purpose. Solomon Bar Simson, a member of the Jewish community in Mainz, described in 1140 the attacks on Jewish communities in Germany, sometimes borrowing from older material. Often, the Jews fled to the bishop’s enclave, where they were promised protection by the bishop, who sincerely opposed the crusading rabble. But when the bishop himself was faced with execution, he sometimes fled, leaving the Jews to fend for themselves. Later, as the more disciplined armies trod through the same territory, the persecution was lessened, but even here Solomon claims that “Godfrey of Boullion, may his bones be ground to dust,” continued in the spirit of the People’s Crusade, “vowing to go on this journey only after avenging the blood of the crucified one by shedding Jewish blood.”

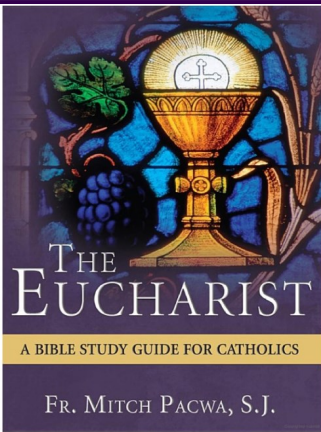
The Baptism of the Lord January/enero 8th
